Sirach 17:24-32 ²⁴ Yet to those who repent he grants a return, and he encourages those who are losing hope. ²⁵ Turn back to the Lord and forsake your sins; pray in his presence and lessen your offense. ²⁶ Return to the Most High and turn away from iniquity, and hate intensely what he abhors. ²⁷ Who will sing praises to the Most High in Hades in place of the living who give thanks? ²⁸ From the dead, as from one who does not exist, thanksgiving has ceased; those who are alive and well sing the Lord's praises. ²⁹ How great is the mercy of the Lord, and his forgiveness for those who return to him! ³⁰ For not everything is within human capability, since human beings are not immortal. ³¹ What is brighter than the sun? Yet it can be eclipsed. So flesh and blood devise evil. ³² He marshals the host of the height of heaven; but all human beings are dust and ashes.

It might seem a little odd to you that I chose the above verses for an Advent devotional. They seem to fit more with Lent than they do with Advent. However, as we have heard from our Gospel lessons for the past two weeks, repentance is a big part of the Advent message. John

was proclaiming a baptism for the repentance of sins, and as we await the coming of the Messiah, we too have heard messages about repentance and preparation. Repenting is a large part of that message of preparation.

In the midst of the Advent season of the church (and the commercial Christmas season), we are constantly reminded to prepare ourselves for the return of the Messiah. Verse 30 above hints at this preparation: ³⁰ "For not everything is within human capability, since human beings are not immortal." We are not immortal, but the one that we wait for is! On Christmas day, we celebrate the birth of the immortal One, Jesus the Christ. We give thanks that God sent his only Son to the world to save all the world from the bondage of sin and the grave. We repent of our sins, pray in the presence of God, and celebrate the greatest gift that was ever given.

As Advent winds to a close and we prepare ourselves for the Christmas season, let us continue to keep the disciplines of repenting and preparing. The return of the Messiah will happen one day. When that day comes, I hope that you are ready.

They will include hiking at Congaree National Park with our families, camping and a dove shoot, whitewater rafting and volleyball once a month, some service project such as Habitat For Humanity among other things. Building Men For Christ is a ministry designed for every man in your congregation to be disciplined into a true follower of Jesus.

Region 9 had their first One Year To Live retreat at Lutheridge the weekend of October 10-12 this year. 21 men accepted the call to be disciplined with another 15 men as leaders. I think all the participants will tell you that while it is not an easy weekend, it is a very spiritually uplifting weekend. One man said that it was the most intense and spiritual weekend of his life.

OYTL is a very well designed protocol that gives the men the insight and courage they need to become the man God intended him to be. We help remove what is holding them back. We hope to have another OYTL weekend in the spring of 2010 near Columbia and another in North Carolina in the fall. Then we can move forward with our plan to bring this to all conferences in our synod with most of our own leaders.

Two side notes about this weekend. We could not find anyone that would feed us. We were in Tennessee promoting men's ministry where 2 men stood up and said, "Here I am, Lord, send me." They had very little knowledge of LMM but they came forward and were touched by the weekend also. The other note is that we try and teach men how to live each day as if they have just one year to live to help prioritize their lives. Larry Madden was on our waiting list and when a place opened up, he and his wife were ecstatic! He drove 9 hours from Pennsylvania to be with us. He made his mark on us and one month later he passed away. He had made the most of his life and we will cherish our time together.

LMM is sponsoring one man from each region to attend our Building Men For Christ workshop in December. Brian Dooley from Faith Lutheran in Pickens has offered his talent and time to learn how to build a REAL men's ministry in each church that sees the opportunity to disciple their men. We will have a synod wide conference in 2010 for each of you.


