From the Mountains to the Sea and from the “Freshwater Coast” to Indian Land, the Lutheran Men and the mission congregations of the South Carolina Synod have been active. Less than a mile from South Carolina’s northeastern border, there is the mission congregation at Crossroads Lutheran Church (Interim Pastor John “Jan” Setzler). Near South Carolina’s northwestern border, one finds the mission congregation at Faith Lutheran Chapel (Pastor Bob Kasting). In the Midlands, the mission congregation at Breath of Life Lutheran Church (Pastor Mikki Corley Gay) brings its ministry in an area changing from rural to suburban. Two Spanish language mission churches — Iglesia Luterana Manatial de Vida (Pastor Sandy Jones) and Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey (Pastor Andres Leone) — bring the Good News in the eastern and western Midlands.

Activity is not limited to the five mission churches. On South Carolina’s western Freshwater Coast (the lakes on the Upper Savannah River), the Lutheran Church by the Lake, through its annual Bob White Golf Tournament, has supported the ministry of South Carolina Lutheran Men in Mission for many years. At Garden City on the Atlantic Ocean, the Lutheran Men Chapter at Shepherd of the Sea Lutheran Church support South Carolina Lutheran Men in Mission with its own annual Gold Tournament. Promotional Secretary Danny Camp has been coordinating efforts to revitalize Men’s Ministry and activities in the Coastal Conference.

As the date of this writing (November 15th), I have been able to make fifty-three trips to mission churches, church LMM meetings, or conference meetings during 2010. The hospitality, Bible Studies, prayers, and the fellowship have been most appreciated.

A Few Good Men

We are looking for a few good men, and like the sparring scene in the movie "A FEW GOOD MEN" between Jack Nicholson (Col. Jessep) and Tom Cruise (Lt. Kaffee), we also search for the truth.

South Carolina Lutheran Men in Mission wants a few good men.

Men of the church step forward. If we need anything in the church today, it would be Christian leadership from men who are versed in the bible, filled with the Spirit, and stepping forward to offer their wisdom and guidance. The apostles knew that the character of the men appointed to serve in the early church was vital to the success of their ministry. Instead of allowing popularity or charisma to determine who would be placed in leadership, the apostles lead the early church to seek only Godly individuals whose reputation, spiritual life, and wisdom would be an asset to the church.

In Lutheran Men, we try follow that same example when looking for a few good men. But, in the process of looking for people to fill slots, we find names and try to train and mold them into the position. There is always a need for dedicated Christian leadership. We know that there is know-how out there. Where can we find such people? Jesus said: "*The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest*". Let us follow the command of Jesus and pray for our Father to send workers.

We are men, we make mistakes but we are going into the fields; we are sowing the seeds, we are asking God for forgiveness and to grant us his Peace. But, believe it or not the Bible does not hide mistakes made by great people. This makes it an extremely valuable text for teaching moral character. In fact, the lessons learned from mistakes often provide a more lasting and powerful impact than those learned from doing things right. These lessons are not only valuable for individuals in positions of leadership but all people who wish to improve their character.



Peter Drucker said "*The better a man is, the more mistakes he will make, for the more new things he will try. I would never promote to a top-level job a man who was not making mistakes...otherwise he is sure to be mediocre.*"

Jacob was one of the patriarchs, a grandson of Abraham, and father of the twelve tribes. His major mistake as a leader of the clan was to designate Joseph prematurely as his successor when he was still young and somewhat irresponsible. Jacob gave Joseph the coat of many colors, a symbol of leadership, when his son was only 17-years old. Joseph, however, was immature and not a good judge of character. Needless to say, his brothers did not like him. Indeed, Joseph would eventually prove to be not only a good clan leader, but would become one of the great leaders of Egypt -- one who would get Egypt through seven years of famine. God guided good men. They made mistakes, but there was forgiveness.

Today we live in a world full of busyness, stress of unbearable proportions, and words are sugar coated in order to please everyone including "Barney" the dog. People today take pride in their values and have devotion for their creator. However, words of love and blessings for others are all but spoken behind closed doors. This is what Jesus says and wants from us today.

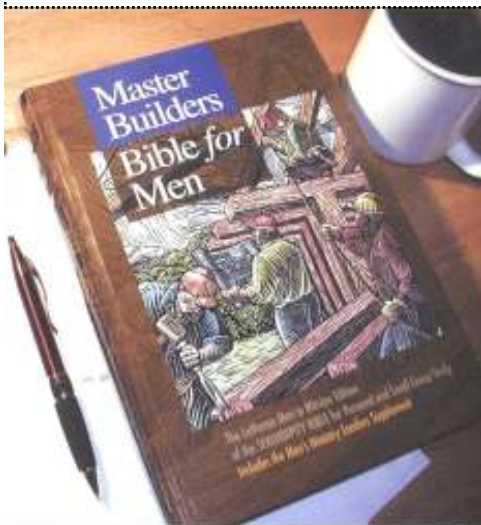
