Through the end of November **504** people have donated **\$52,000** to the Committee of 100 New Mission Start Program and **\$7,275** to the Loan Fund. Our commitments to our New Mission Start Churches is \$70,000 this year. So, we need a real Lutheran end-of-year rush to make our goal and meet our commitment for 2015. Remember, all of our churches were once New Mission Start congregations. So, let's ramp up during this Advent Season and get this done.

At the June meeting of the SCLMM executive board the men of our Synod took this to heart. We voted unanimously to designate Sunday November 1, 2015 as Pee Dee Indian Tribe Sunday in the South Carolina Synod. November is also Native American month throughout our great country. Now is an opportunity to help a group of our own brothers and sisters in Christ right here in our own back yard.

The Pee Dee Indians are a proud people. They have a great heritage and unfortunately many of them live at or below the poverty level. They have operated their tribal affairs on three

acres of land for many years. Recently due to the generosity of Dr. and Mrs. C.W. Love the Pee Dee Tribe received a donation of 15 acres of land. The tribe has a great dream for this land.

It is their desire to construct a multipurpose building on this property. They would like to have a building to be used as free medical clinic, a shelter for the homeless, a place for children to play in a safe environment, and a building to use for gatherings with a small area set aside as a museum of their heritage. They have plans for two different sizes of buildings. One is about 1200 square feet and the other is about 3000 square feet. Estimates on the smaller are about \$98,000.00. On the larger \$180,000.00. They can of course build the smaller one and expand when possible.

With the blessings of Bishop Herman Yoos and the South Carolina Synod Council, SCLMM has designated November 1st as Pee Dee Indian Project Sunday. We are asking a special offering for this cause. The SCLMM goal is to raise \$50,000.00 to help the Pee Dee Tribe with this project. If November 1st does not suit your calendar please feel free to designate another Sunday. If possible, please send one check from your church's total collection for this. Individual checks will of course be welcomed.


